Remote Learning Guidance for Parents

What we expect of our pupils:

- Your child will need to register at the beginning and end of every school day via the 'OHA Year 7' class. This will be checked by the Head of School and Assistant Head teacher, who will contact you to check the welfare of any absent pupils. This is also where they should raise any difficulties or issues they are facing.
- Pupils are expected to follow their normal school timetable via Google Classrooms. Here, members of teaching staff will upload daily lessons to the correct classroom area.
- The expectation of each pupil is that they are to submit a piece of work per lesson via the appropriate class, as outlined on the lesson instructions. Pupils will complete the work set and return it to staff via the Google Classroom platform.
- Teachers will be 'in' the Google Classroom during the lesson time. Therefore, we expect our pupils to ask questions and raise issues during the lesson just as they would if they were in school. We also expect them to respond to teacher questions during the lesson.
- Teachers will feedback on students work. This may be via the rubric or personalised comment.
- If there are specific problems with internet or device access, please contact Miss Rawson (rawsons@oha.swecet.org) or Miss McGrane (mcgranes@oha.swecet.org) for adapted plans to be put in place.

What you should expect from us:

- We will continue to follow the normal curriculum and manage the learning of pupils in the same way we would if they were in school.
- If a member of staff is not able to be in the classroom during the lesson time due to staff illness then we will endeavour to ensure that work is set by another member of staff.

- We will continue to provide feedback on work submitted with at least the same regularity we would if the pupils were in school.
- We will follow up on daily non-attendance.
- We will continue to assess the progress pupils are making.
- A weekly phone call from tutors to check on pupil welfare will be made.
- The school remains open to vulnerable and Key Worker children. These pupils will have their online learning supervised in school.

*Clearly, each family is having to navigate their own circumstances at the moment and we are very aware that there may well be circumstances where these expectations are not able to be followed. **If that is the case, please inform us so that we can support as best we can and adjust any expectations accordingly to fit individual circumstance.***
